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the importance of drama in primary school has been elevated in recent years with many teachers continuing to make it high priority in their teaching they recognise that it can enrich children s understanding of the world and motivate and encourage them in other curriculum work this lively and readable book offers a blend of theory and practice based on the author s own considerable experience as a drama teacher he provides numerous examples taken from work with children in schools which will help teachers to prepare for drama sessions in the classroom the book examines the role of drama as a subject in its own right as well as its role in delivering other aspects of the curriculum within primary education it assumes no prior knowledge of teaching drama and will

therefore be useful to trainee teachers and in service teachers wanting to make use of drama in their daily teaching

this book includes a royalty free play script for teen actors called the weird wild and wonderful days of school this play has a flexible cast not all scenes need to be performed and actors can play multiple parts because no characters repeat from scene to scene the smallest cast you could have by doing all the scripts would be three males and four females but there are many as 49 speaking roles possible
